#### **CONFERENCE SITE**

The historic **Omni Parker House** at 60 School Street, Boston, MA is the oldest and longest continuously operating hotel in the United States. It is located in old town Boston, along the Freedom Trail, and walking distance from many attractions —including Faneuil Hall Market Place, Old City Hall, the Massachusetts State House, Boston Common, the New England Aquarium, the Public Gardens and more. It is a short (less than 15 minutes) taxi ride to the JFK Presidential Museum & Library, Bunker Hill Museum, the USS Constitution Museum, the Museum of Fine Arts, and the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum.

# NPSA is pleased to share the following professional news and to congratulate members on their achievements!

**Thomas J. Baldino**, Emeritus Professor of Political Science, Wilkes University, and **Paula Holoviak**, Professor of Political Science & Public Administration, Kutztown University, will have their book, *Pennsylvania Government and Politics: Understanding Public Policy in the Keystone State*, published by the Pennsylvania State University Press, spring 2024. They will host a roundtable discussion of the book at the conference.

**Berk Cebeci** defended his master's thesis: "Missiles and Bureaucrats: The Reagan Administration and the Making of Two-Pronged Security Diplomacy," at Bilkent University in Turkey. The thesis focuses on the Reagan administration's contact with the Soviet Union and allies in Western Europe within the scope of arms control and nuclear confrontation. He also presented "Timid yet Progressive: The Establishment of Turkish American Affairs in the Interbellum" at the annual conference of the Turkish Political Science Association in June 2023.

Sam Edwards, Associate Professor of Legal Studies Quinnipiac University co-edited a volume: Edwards, III, S. B. & Masterson, J. R. (Eds.) (2023). *Government Response to Disruptive Innovation: Perspectives and Examinations*. IGI Global. The book examines government responses to disruptive innovation with case studies from around the world. Dr. Edwards also contributed a chapter on AI and legal services that was presented at last year's NPSA conference.

**Stephen Farnsworth**, Professor of Political Science at the University of Mary Washington, is coauthor of a new book, *Late-Night in Washington: Political Humor and the American Presidency*, recently published by Routledge. Dr. Farnsworth has also been named the J. William Fulbright Distinguished Scholar in Humanities and Social Sciences at the University of Warsaw, Poland, for Spring 2024.

**David Fott**, Professor and Chair, Department of Political Science, University of Nevada, Las Vegas published "Philosophy, Politics, and Rhetoric in Cicero's *on the Orator*." *Interpretation: A Journal of Political Philosophy* 49 (Spring 2023): 353-73. He is now serving as chair of the Department of Political Science at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

**Timothy E. Lewis** received tenure and promotion to Associate Professor in the Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE) Department of Political Science. Dr. Lewis specializes in the politics of marginalized and disadvantaged identities, primarily Black Americans. His work has been published in the *National Political Science Review*, *Politics*, *Groups*, *and Identities*, and the *Journal of Homosexuality*.

**J.
